Defined Benefit Plan

- The Maryland State Retirement and Pension System is a 401(a) defined benefit pension plan: sra.maryland.gov
- The System is employer-sponsored, and participation is a **mandatory** condition of employment.
- Benefits defined by a formula using salary history and service credit.
- System is responsible for all investment risk and portfolio management.



Defined Contribution Plan

- The Maryland Supplemental Retirement Plan (MSRP) offers separate optional retirement savings plans: MarylandDC.com
- Participation is elective.
- Examples: 457(b), 403(b) or 401(k) plans
 offered through sponsors such as Nationwide.
- Participants assume all investment risk and responsibility for portfolio management but can seek professional financial advice.

Pension Systems

(Reform, Alternate, Contributory, Non-Contributory)

- Employees'
- Teachers'
- Law Enforcement Officers' (LEOPS)

Retirement Systems

- Employees' (No new members as of 1/1/1980)
- Teachers' (No new members as of 1/1/1980)
- Correctional Officers' (CORS)
- Maryland State Police



Membership: Pension Systems

Eligibility Service

- Determines when you become eligible for a benefit
- 500 hours worked in a fiscal year = one year of eligibility service

Creditable Service

- Determines the amount of the benefit
- Based on hours worked and contributions made



Membership Retirement Systems

- Eligibility and Creditable service are one and the same
 - Earned month by month as employee contributions are received
 - Determines eligibility for benefits and amount of the benefit



Retirement Eligibility Requirements

Age and/or eligibility service requirements to qualify for early or normal retirement differ depending on date of hire and the Pension or Retirement System of enrollment.

Vested Benefits (Members enrolled prior to 7/1/2011)

- 5 years of eligibility service regardless of plan =
 Vested
 - Member retains accrued benefit as long as no withdrawal of contributions
- Benefit payable in future at the plan's normal or early retirement age (if applicable) with a reduced benefit



Vested Benefits (Members enrolled on or after 7/1/2011)

- 10 years of eligibility service regardless of plan
 Vested
 - Member retains accrued benefit as long as no withdrawal of contributions
- Benefit payable in future at the plan's normal or early retirement age (if applicable) with a reduced benefit



Commencement of Vested Benefit

Employees' and Teachers' Pension Systems (Enrolled prior to 7/1/2011)

- Service Retirement (full benefit)
 - Age 62
- Early Retirement (reduced benefit)
 - Age 55 with at least 15 years of eligibility service
 - Greatest reduction is 42%



Commencement of Vested Benefit

Employees' and Teachers' Pension Systems (Enrolled on or after 7/1/2011)

- Service Retirement (full benefit)
 - Age 65
- Early Retirement (reduced benefit)
 - Age 60 with at least 15 years of eligibility service
 - Greatest reduction is 30%



Commencement of Vested Benefit

- Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System (LEOPS): Age 50
- Employees' and Teachers' Retirement Systems (No new members as of 1/1/1980): Age 60
- Correctional Officers' Retirement System (CORS): Age 55
- Maryland State Police Retirement System: Age
 50

Maryland State Retiree Health Benefits

Eligible if State retiree receiving a monthly State retirement allowance and meet the following criteria:

(State employees hired prior to 7/1/11)

- Leave State service with at least 16 years of creditable service (State employees hired on or after 7/1/11)
- Leave State service with at least 25 years of creditable service


